Visitors to our websites

When someone visits <http://www.digitalfilmarchive.net/> we collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns. We do this to find out things such as the number of visitors to the various parts of the site. We collect this information in a way that does not identify anyone. We do not attempt to find out the identities of those visiting our website. We will not associate any data gathered from this site with any personally identifying information from any source. If we do want to collect personally identifiable information through our website, we will be up front about this. We will make it clear when we collect personal information and will explain what we intend to do with it.

Use of cookies by Northern Ireland Screen

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site. The following explains the cookies we use and why.

Strictly Necessary Cookies

Some cookies are strictly necessary to enable users to move around a website and use its various features. Others are necessary to protect the website from certain types of malicious attacks.

Name	Description
_AntiXsrfToken	Helps protect against XSRF attacks
.AspNet.ApplicationCookie	Used by ASP.NET to allow users to log in to a user account

Functionality Cookies

Functionality cookies are not essential, but they enhance your use of our website.

When you share content via social media, these sites may set a cookie if you are also logged in to their service. We don't control third party cookies but we recommend you visit the relevant website for more information.

Name	Description
_atuvc	Created and used by AddThis, a plugin to offer ways to share content
dfa-cookie-notice	Used to decide if the cookie notice us to be shown on the website
Dfa-favs	To allow a non-registered website visitor to save favourite content.

Google Analytics Cookies

These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the site. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form:

A - stores each user's amount of visits, and the time of the first visit, the previous visit, and the current visit. B &

C - are used to check approximately how long you stay on a site: when a visit starts, and approximately ends

Z - stores where a visitor came from (search engine, search keyword, link). To opt out of being tracked by

__ga	Used to distinguish users.
__gat	Used to throttle request rate.
__utma	Used to distinguish users and sessions. The cookie is created when the javascript library executes and no existing __utma cookies exists. The cookie is updated every time data is sent to Google Analytics.
__utmt	Used to throttle request rate.
__utmb	Used to determine new sessions/visits. The cookie is created when the javascript library executes and no existing __utmb cookies exists. The cookie is updated every time data is sent to Google Analytics.
__utmc	Not used in ga.js. Set for interoperability with urchin.js. Historically, this cookie operated in conjunction with the __utmb cookie to determine whether the user was in a new session/visit.
__utmz	Stores the traffic source or campaign that explains how the user reached your site. The cookie is created when the javascript library executes and is updated every time data is sent to Google Analytics.
__utmv	Used to store visitor-level custom variable data. This cookie is created when a developer uses the _setCustomVar method with a visitor level custom variable. This cookie was also used for the deprecated _setVar method. The cookie is updated every time data is sent to Google Analytics.

If you want to control which cookies you accept, you can configure your browser to accept all cookies or to alert you every time a cookie is offered by a website's server. Most browsers automatically accept cookies. You can set your browser option so that you will not receive cookies and you can also delete existing cookies from your browser. You may find that some parts of the site will not function properly if you have refused cookies.

Most web browsers allow some control of most cookies through the browser settings.
